• African American Boys Sowers Scholarship (Open to African American Boys participants only)

This \$2,500 scholarship is is a one-time award to a GCPS high school graduating male senior who plans to enroll full time to continue his education at a Historically Black College or University (HBCU).

Deadline: March 31

Requirements:

- o Minimum GPA on a 4.0 scale is 2.75
- o Provide two letters of recommendation (non-family member)
- Submit a 750 word essay to describe yourself, your college plans, and how you are going to make a difference in your community.

• Akilah Bateman Band Scholarship (open to Meadowcreek HS graduating seniors only)

A one-time award of \$300 sponsored by the family and friends in memory of Akilah Bateman to a graduating senior of Meadowcreek High School who has demonstrated proficiency in music with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in the field of music.

Requirements:

- o Applicants must have a 3/0 GPA on a 4/0 scale
- O Submit a letter of recommendation by a music teacher or administrator
- Have plans to enroll in an accredited college, university, or music school the fall following graduation
- O Submit a one-page essay on how music makes a difference our everyday lives

• Alton C. Crews Educator Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,000 sponsored by the GCPS Foundation will be presented to a graduating senior who has met the following requirements. One or more recipient may be named.

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- o Exhibit good character and leadership skills
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Submit a two-page essay describing interest in the teaching profession Application

• Area 2 Gwinnett County Council of PTA Scholarship (open to applicants who attend Area 2 School: Peachtree Ridge, Lanier, North Gwinnett, Paul Duke STEM, Collins Hill, Duluth, GSMST, Mountain View, Norcross)

A one-time award of \$750 solely funded through the local PTA council membership and council contributions. Area 2 is proud to present this scholarship to one deserving high school senior attending each of the Area 2 high schools listed above (a total of 8 scholarships awarded) and has successfully met or exceeded the State of Georgia graduation requirements, with plans to continue their education by attending an accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational/trade school, or pursue other post-graduate education/training. Requirements:

- o Applicant must be a graduating senior of an Area 2 high school with a PTA/PTSA
- o The PTA must be in good standing (ie. Paid dues, approved bylaws on file
- o The applicant and at least 1 adult from their household must be a PTSA member
- o Applicant is planning to attend an accredited two or four-year college or university, vocational/trade school, or pursue other post-graduate education/training.
- Applicant has a satisfactory scholastic record acknowledge by an administrator, counselor, or teacher. Application

• Atlanta Gladiators Aim High Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,000 will be presented to a GCPS graduating senior(s) with interest in a career in sports medicine, sports management, event planning, or related field. Applicants must have plans to enroll in an accredited college or university for fall 2022. One or more recipient may be named.

* A scholarship recognition event is tentatively planned (barring Covid schedule changes) for the final home game of the Atlanta Gladiators at Gas South Arena. Recipients will be provided with additional details.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- O Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- O Submit a one-page essay describing interest in a career in sports medicine, sports management, event planning, or related field <u>Application</u>

• Beauty P. Baldwin Scholarship (open to students of African American descent)

Upsilon Alpha Omega, the Gwinnett Chapter of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc., was chartered in Gwinnett County on January 29, 1994. One of the first challenges taken on by the chapter was to establish a scholarship for young women in Gwinnett County. The scholarship was named in honor of one of our chartering members, Mrs. Beauty P. Baldwin. Thus far, we have awarded numerous scholarships totaling thousands of dollars to college-bound high school seniors.

Upsilon Alpha Omega is offering a scholarship to African American high school seniors to further their educational opportunities. It is the chapter's goal to promote post-secondary

education endeavors. The scholarship will be awarded to students who meet the following scholarship qualifications:

Requirements:

- o Must be a Gwinnett County Public School senior
- o Of African American descent (male or female)
- o Must already be accepted to an accredited four-year college or university
- o Must possess leadership potential and discernible good character
- o Must demonstrate superior scholastic achievement (minimum 3.0 GPA)

Deadline: March 1

• Beth Rihm Global Language Scholarship (open to Brookwood HS students only)

This scholarship is a one-time award of up to \$1,000 that will be awarded to a GCPS senior who has demonstrated a proficiency in a spoken foreign language and is seeking to deepen fluency through cultural immersion or extracurricular study.

One or more recipient may be named.

This scholarship was reestablished in 2015 by Rachel B. Mehravari, a Brookwood HS alumna and former Beth Rihm memorial scholarship recipient. Ms. Mehravari credits a Rihm scholarship with helping her achieve her goal of becoming a member of the Foreign Service in the Diplomatic Service of the United States of America.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a foreign language faculty member
- O Submit a one-page essay describing an interest in foreign languages. Application

• Beyond the Spectrum Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

This scholarship provides support for deserving students who are bound for postsecondary education, are a high school senior, and who is currently diagnosed with an autism spectrum disorder.

<u>Application</u>

Interested applicants must submit a completed scholarship application, as well as any required documents, by March 10

• Brenden and Alex Elbaz Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

The Brenden and Alex Elbaz Memorial Scholarship was initially established through the Gwinnett County Public Schools Foundation and was exclusive to a Lanier High School Student where his mother Joy Crowe was a teacher.

^{*}The Scholarship process will open in January 2024 with additional directions provided at that time.

Application

In 2011 Brenden Elbaz, at the age of 23, tragically died of a drug overdose. Nine years later, in 2020, Alex Elbaz at the age of 27, lost his life to Fentanyl Poisoning. Brothers Brenden and Alex were 5 years apart and very close. Both college students at the time. Brenden was a political science major at University of North Ga., formerly known as Gainesville State University, and Alex was a month from graduating Georgia Gwinnett College with a degree in accounting, which was received posthumously.

Brenden and Alex were loved immensely by their family, friends and all those that knew them. They both encountered personal challenges which they battled to overcome, and each will be remembered in that spirit.

Scholarship Criteria:

- o Acceptance to any accredited post- secondary institution
- Write a one-page essay explaining how you faced adversity in your life and exhibited strength in the face of personal challenges. Your essay must include how you were able to overcome the hardship and how it changed you; please share your dreams and aspirations as well

• Brothers Making Moves LLC Scholarship (open to Lanier HS students only)

This scholarship is a one-time award up to \$1000 to a senior at Lanier High School who is the first in his/her family to attend college. Applicants must have a 2.5 GPA and have applied to a two or four-year program at an accredited technical school, college, or university. Application can be requested through the counseling office at Lanier High School.

Deadline: March 15

• Captain Hugh N. Mulzac Scholarship (open to students of all backgrounds and academic levels district-wide who have a strong commitment to the maritime industry and a desire to serve their country through pursuing a career in the merchant marines)

This scholarship is a one-time award \$1,000 to seniors who are pursuing a career in the merchant marines. Captain Hugh Mulzac was known as the captain who fought racial injustice, fascism, and McCarthyism. Captain Mulzac (March 26, 1886 – January 30, 1971) was an African-Caribbean member of the United States Merchant Marine. He earned a Master rating in 1918, which should have qualified him to command a ship, but racial discrimination prevented this from occurring until September 29, 1942. He was passionate about having a career at sea, education, and ensuring all people have access and opportunity to achieve their dreams.

The Captain Hugh N. Mulzac Scholarship is merit-based and designed to provide financial assistance to students who are currently enrolled or planning to enroll in a U.S. Merchant Marine Academy or a U.S. Maritime College.

- o Exhibit good character and leadership skills.
- o Must be a minority student (including but not limited to African American, Hispanic/Latinx, Native American, or Asian American).
- o Currently enrolled or attended Gwinnett County Public Schools.
- o Currently enrolled or planning to enroll in the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy or a U.S. Maritime College.
- o Minimum GPA of 3.0 on a scale of 4.0.
- o Provide a letter of reference from a faculty member.
- Submit a two-page letter explaining why you are passionate about serving their country through the merchant marines and how you plan to use your education to make a positive impact in your community or country.
- Submit your academic transcripts to [insert email address or physical address] by [insert deadline].

• Celeste Norton Wilbanks Memorial Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

Established in 2021 in honor of Celeste Norton Wilbanks, wife of former CEO/Superintendent J. Alvin Wilbanks, a one-time \$5,000 scholarship will be awarded by sponsor Peach State Federal Credit Union. In addition, the Gwinnett County Public School Foundation will award a one-time Celeste Norton Wilbanks Scholarship in the amount of \$2,500. No additional application is needed to be considered for both. Applicants will be considered for both, but rules exclude both scholarships going to one winner.

In recognition of Mrs. Wilbanks legacy as a faithful community servant and dedicated friend, applicants must be a college-bound senior who has demonstrated compassion, citizenship, and strong moral character in his/her local school or community.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- Submit a typed essay describing (1) what motivated the applicant to become a positive influence and, (2) what effect the applicants' positive example had on his/her local school or community
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a school administrator, counselor or community leader
- o Provide a short summary of community volunteer or school leader Application

Clara Barton Aspiring Nurse Scholarship (Open Dacula and Mountain View students only)

This annual one-time award of \$500 - \$1,000 scholarship was established by Shelli-Ann McKenzie. As a Registered Nurse, Dacula resident, community leader, and Founder of Help for Healthcare Professionals (HHCP), a local nonprofit, she felt impressed to support local youth in pursuing a career in nursing.

In an effort to further motivate and incentivize high school students, the Clara Barton Aspiring Nurse Award & Scholarship will be presented annually. HHCP will recognize two outstanding High School

seniors who have been accepted into a 2-year or 4-year nursing program. *One graduating student from each Dacula and Mountain View High Schools will be selected annually.

A one-time award of \$1000 to a female senior at Shiloh High School who is in the top 10% of her class who is interested in pursuing a career in Business or Entrepreneurship.

Requirements:

- o Proof of class rank (1st semester senior transcript)
- A two-page double-spaced, typed essay expressing your desire to continue your education in pursuit of a career in Business or Entrepreneurship.
 - Describe experiences you have had which influence your decision regarding a future career in Business or Entrepreneurship.

• Courtney S. Blair Student Leadership Scholarship (Open to applicants district-wide)

A one-time award of \$1000 to a senior who is in the top 5% of his or her class and a member of the Gwinnett Student Leadership Team.

Requirements:

- o Proof of class rank (1st semester senior transcript)
- o A two-page double-spaced, typed essay expressing
 - Reflecting over your high school years, share an experience in which you exercised significant leadership in your school and describe the result of your efforts.

• Courtney S. Blair Outstanding Excellence in Athletics and Academics Scholarship (Open to applicants district-wide)

A one-time award of \$2000 to a senior who is in the top 1% of his or her class who letters in two or more varsity sports.

- o Proof of class rank (1st semester senior transcript)
- o Proof of each varsity letter, signed by the coach.

• Dr. Robert (Bob) Clarke Memorial Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,000 in honor of Dr. Bob Clarke, a school psychologist at Gwinnett County Public Schools will be presented to a GCPS high school graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in a course of study in school psychology, social work, or a STEM healthcare field. Association.

Requirements:

- o Applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0. scale
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member or community leader
- Submit a one-page essay describing interest in a career in school psychology, social work, or a STEM healthcare field. <u>Application</u>

• Dr. Janice L. Calkins Speech Language Pathology Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

An award of \$1,000 will be presented to **one or more** graduating seniors from GCPS seeking to pursue a bachelor's degree in speech language pathology. Upon completion of their bachelors and acceptance into a Master of Science program in speech language pathology, award recipients with an interest in public education may apply for an additional \$1,000 match. The Master of Science program must be at a college or university accredited by the Council on Academic Accreditation in Audiology and Speech Language Pathology (CAA) of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

Requirements:

- Applicants must submit an essay sharing why you desire a career in the field of speechlanguage pathology.
- o High School applicants must have a minimum 3.0 GPA out of 4.0 scale, have a minimum 20 hours (or more) of observation of a practicing Speech Language Pathologist in any setting
- o Submit a copy of your first-semester transcript, SAT and/or ACT scores
- o Submit two letters of recommendation (one of which preferably from practicing SLP), other from a teacher, counselor, or administrator,
- Have plans to enroll in an accredited college or university for fall 2022.

• Dr. Tarece Johnson-Morgan Scholarship for the Arts (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1000 presented to a college bound GCPS senior districtwide. One or more recipients may be named. Emphasis will be placed on participation in the arts (painting, graphic design, illustration, sculpture, literature, film, music, dance, theater, poetry, photography and/or fashion) and volunteer work demonstrating a commitment to making a difference in the community.

If preferred, instead of writing an essay, applicants have the option to submit a 3-minute video describing how art has improved your life and what you want to do with your art in the future.

Deadline: June 1

• GCPS Foundation Mathematics Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,500 will be presented to a GCPS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in science, technology, engineering, or math. One or more recipient may be named.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 2.7 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Submit a one-page essay describing interest in a STEM related career. Application

• GCPS Foundation Multicultural Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

Established in 2015 and sponsored by the Gwinnett Multicultural Advisory Committee, this Scholarship is a one-time award of \$1,000 presented to a college bound GCPS senior of Hispanic, African American, Asian/Pacific Islander or other minority origin. One or more recipient may be named. Emphasis will be placed on leadership roles, community service or volunteer work demonstrating a commitment to the community.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 3.0 cumulative GPA on 4.0 scale
- Submit a two page, double-spaced, typed essay describing community involvement and the impact from their work
- o Provide a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Have plans to enroll in an accredited college or university for fall 2022. Application

• GCPS Foundation STEM Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$1,500 will be presented to a GCPS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study in science, technology, engineering, or mathematics. One or more recipient may be named.

Requirements:

- o Applicant must have a minimum 2.7 GPA on a 4.0. scale
- O Submit a letter of recommendation from a faculty member
- o Submit a one-page essay describing an interest in a STEM-related career Application

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Scholarship and Grant

Begun in 1978, the **Gwinnett Regional Science**, **Engineering and Innovation Fair** is the gateway event for science, technology, engineering, or mathematics projects (STEM) seeking to advance to state/national competition and the goal of competing against the world's best at the **International Science and Engineering Fair**.

The Gwinnett Regional Science, Engineering, and Innovation Fair hosts' students from middle and high schools representing all Gwinnett County Public School (GCPS) clusters, as well as GCPS special entity schools and participating non-GCPS private or public schools that operate in Gwinnett County. Among the special entity schools competing each year is the **Gwinnett School of Mathematics**, Science and Technology, a school consistently ranked as among the top ten best STEM high schools in the nation by U.S. News and World Report.

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Grant (open to science fair participants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$500 may be presented to a GCPS junior (or team) demonstrating exceptional creativity and problem solving at the regional level. The grant is intended to reimburse for registration, travel, shipping, and/or STEM project creation expenses related to competition at any level. No application necessary.

• GCPS Foundation Science, Engineering, and Innovation Scholarship (Open to science fair participants districtwide)

A \$1,000 will be presented in recognition of outstanding performance at the regional level to a one-time to a GCPS senior with plans to enroll full-time at the post-secondary level in a course of study in science, technology, engineering, or math. One or more recipients may be named. No application necessary.

• Georgia United Credit Union Foundation Young Leaders Scholarship (open to female applicants districtwide)

A one-time award of \$2,000 will be presented to a graduating female that has distinguished herself as a community volunteer, entrepreneur, or school leader with results that make the community a better place for all. One or more recipient may be named.

Requirements:

- o Applicant should have a minimum 3.0 GPA on a 4.0 scale
- o Submit a letter of recommendation from a school administrator or community leader
- Submit a short essay describing work as a community volunteer, entrepreneur, or school leader.

The scholarship is sponsored by Georgia United Credit Union Foundation and administered by the Gwinnett County Public Schools Foundation.

• Geri Flanary Memorial Scholarship (open to Duluth HS applicants only)

Annually, a one-time award of \$1,000 will be presented to a GCPS Duluth HS graduating senior with plans to enroll full-time in an undergraduate course of study at an accredited college, university, technical, or trade school. Geri Flanary was the heart and soul of the

school and was dedicated to caring for students in need. Because she was dedicated to helping those in true financial need succeed educationally, the ideal candidate will demonstrate financial need and will plan on serving the community to help the greater good.

Requirements:

- o Applicants must demonstrate financial need through being a free and reduced lunch recipient, 3.0 GPA
- O Submit a letter of recommendation by a faculty member with whom the student works with during their senior year
- O Submit a 600-word essay describing a challenge that the student has overcome, the plans the student has for his/her educational future, and how that future will impact the greater good and society. Application
- GIVE Center Scholarship (open to those who have attended the GIVE Center and are graduating seniors only)

This scholarship is a one-time award of \$500 given to one current or former GIVE Center student who plans to attend a trade, technical, or collegiate institution. Applications will be accepted from August 2, 2021, to March 1, 2022. <u>Application</u>

• <u>GSMST Outstanding Senior STEM Scholarship</u> (open to GSMST HS seniors only) Sponsored by the GCPS Foundation

This **one-time** award of \$1,500 will recognize exemplary performance by a GSMST graduating senior. One or more recipient may be named. Recipients will have taken classes beyond the required curriculum while at GSMST and participated in STEM-related activities at school and in the community (clubs, teams, tutoring, etc.). Requirements:

o Applicants will apply online through the GPCS Foundation website

- Submit an essay detailing the following: "How has your GSMST experience influenced your future college and/or career goals? What STEM activities, courses, and/or clubs had the greatest effect on your career development?"
- Gwinnett County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated Scholarship (open to all Black/African American high school seniors who attend school in Gwinnett County (excluding high schools in Centerville, Snellville, and Loganville)

Applicants who are the children of members of the Gwinnett County Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. are not eligible for this scholarship.

Requirements:

A complete online application that consists of the following:

- o A typed essay on a selected topic (refer to Essay tab)
- o An electronic copy of your high school transcript (refer to Education tab)
- o Three (3) electronically submitted letters of recommendation (refer to Recommendations tab)

Deadline: All items must be submitted electronically by Tuesday, January 31.

All completed applications will be reviewed and scored by the Scholarship Committee of the Gwinnett County Alumnae Chapter. The top-scoring applicants will be granted an interview in March 2023, to determine the scholarship recipients. All scholarship recipients will be notified no later than April 7, 2023. Application

• Gwinnett County Retired Educators Assoc. Student Teaching Scholarship (open to applicants districtwide)
